
ICMM's Transitions Handbook encourages a collaborative approach—supporting resilience and long-term social progress.

Approaches include mine closure consultative groups, collaborative regional planning processes, and post-mining joint ventures.

In these collaborations, mining companies play different roles, such as convenor, co-participant, process lead, and advocate.
